Information Session Comments

- 1. By using language such as "what will your legacy be" I feel like you are implying that I don't care. Maybe if students could actually graduate on time, your traffic would go down in the Union and the WELL.
- I don't see how any pride or value would be added to my degree. I come here for academics, not to socialize or attend events. I will NOT be bragging about an event center or the events held there.
- 3. When did school become a business? Instead of raising students' fees you and your company should generate your own money.
- 4. Building a new building will make the rush hour for getting across campus even worse.
- 5. The top universities are known for their research and development. An event is leisure, it is not a degree and it will not benefit me or this campus.
- 6. I think the questionnaire you sent us was biased because you didn't include the year in which the mortgage would be paid off.
- 7. I think it is ridiculous that the President's salary continues to go up despite budget cuts and the state our economy is in. Everyone has suffered except him. This event center is just another way to cause students to suffer and ignore our academic needs.

Financial aid already will have already been decided for the year, so students would have to get additional loan funds due to the tuition line item.
